Welcome back to the Summer Term!

We hope you all had a lovely Easter and enjoyed the sunshine!

We are all very excited to be back and are ready to hit the ground running in the last term of the year.

Topics

For the first half term, Reception's learning will centre around the story 'Clem and Crab' which provides many learning opportunities around beaches, littering and recycling, caring for animals and their habitats and the season of summer. Nursery's book, 'The Pirates are Coming!', is a wonderful story about families, pirates, maps, boats, and under the sea themes.

For the second half term, both year groups will explore the story 'Romeosaurus and Juliet-Rex'. It is a wonderfully age appropriate (and very funny!) take on the classic Shakespeare story, with themes of families, differences, dinosaurs, and friendships.



Phonics

The children will be continuing to learn their phonics this term. Nursery will be working on really imbedding phase 1 skills, and introducing some initial sounds from Phase 2 (s,a,t,p,i,n) and Reception will be starting phase 4 phonics, focusing on consonant blends.

Reading

Please continue to choose books from the 'Bedtime Books' and read these stories at home with your child. Reception will continue to change their reading books on a Monday and Thursday. Please ensure you are logging them on BoomReader.

Please support your child to decode the words, focus on their comprehension (understanding of the book) and their expression when reading.

P.E and Games - Reception's P.E. is Tuesday and Thursday, and Nursery's is on Monday. Reception's topic is 'Jumping 1' and 'Hands 2'. Nursery will be playing 'games for understanding'. Both will then practice for Sport Day in Summer 2. We kindly remind you to make sure that your child is wearing a **sensible** pair of shoes, preferably Velcro as it makes it easier for your child to take their shoes off and on and prevents tripping.



Home Learning

You will continue to receive your child's '**next step**' via Tapestry to work on at home which will help your children with their learning and progress. It continues to be essential to us this year to have a strong working relationship with parents in order to help children progress in their learning, and is in keeping with our Christian Value of Community. We ask that you send any learning or 'WOW' moments to us through **Tapestry**. We will continue to check Tapestry weekly and replying to the children as well as sharing their achievements in class.

Relationships and Health Education

(Personal, Social and Emotional development)- To the children this is known as Jigsaw.

In the first half term the children will be learning about Relationships. This will entail the children to talk about how others show feelings, talk about their own and others behaviour, and its consequences and know that some behaviour is unacceptable.

In the second half term the children will learn about 'Changing Me'. In this topic the children will learn how to adjust their behaviour and take changes of routine in their stride.



RE

In the first half term the children will be looking into the question 'What makes every person unique and precious?' This topic lays foundations for understanding the Christian belief that all humans are made in the image of God, each an 'incarnation', a physical being known and loved by him. In the second half term, in keeping with our Christian value, Responsibility, children will be focusing on the question 'How can we care for our wonderful world?'. Christians believe humans are a special part of God's creation and have a God-given responsibility to care for the incredible world we all share.



School Checklist

Please remember that your child needs to bring the following items to school **EVERY** day:

- Book bag to hold reading books, and any letters that are handed out.
- A summer hat.
- A water bottle.
- A named coat (for those rainy days)
- And for when the weather gets warmer in the summer months please make sure your child wears sun cream to school.
