Save the Date - Parenting Course 'Who's In Charge?' starting 30th January 2026 at St Andrew's School

The 'Who's in Charge?' Course is a 9 week programme run by Rivers Behaviour Team. The course has been run successfully in several schools in Hertfordshire. The course is delivered face to face and is for parents and carers of children 4 years and over.

This is for parents or carers who may be facing difficult or distressing behaviour from their children and are looking for help to feel more supported and regain a sense of calm and control.

The group aims to:

- Provide a supportive environment to share experiences and ideas
- Reduce the guilt and shame which most parents feel
- Offer ideas to help you develop individual strategies for managing your child's behaviour
- Explore ways of increasing safety and well-being
- Help parents feel more in control and less stressed.

Important Safety Notice

Over the last few weeks, we have had several messages from parents and neighbours about inconsiderate or unsafe parking and driving near the school.

Whilst I understand that pick up and drop off times are inevitably busy, can I please draw everyone's attention to the following:

- Parking by the bottom field gate on Oudle Lane MUST still allow for a fire engine or ambulance to pass through AT ALL TIMES PLEASE. We have children and staff on site at all times of the day and unsafe parking puts them at risk.
- If you are parking at the recreation ground or on the side of the road on Tower Hill, please park considerately. Headlights from parked vehicles can be blinding for both traffic and pedestrians.
- Please drive slowly past the school and be aware of small children.
- Please do not park in front of neighbours' driveways, even for a short time.

East Herts Council are looking into possible improvements to the area as part of their Local Cycling and Walking Infrastructure Plan (LCWIP).

We are a Nut-Free School

St Andrew's is a 'No Nut' school. Please do not bring any foods containing nut or sesame into school (including pesto and hummus). Thank you.



Pupil Premium and Free School Meals

The school is aware that with the Universal Infant Free School Meals (UIFSM) programme automatically providing all children up to the end of Year 2 with a free meal every day, many families do not apply for means-tested free school meal provision until their child reaches Year 3. **This could mean parents are missing out on other sources of support they are entitled to**, linked to household income and the benefits of associated pupil premium funding.

When your child reaches year 3 school meals become chargeable.



What is a Free School Meal? A KS2 school meal costs £3.50 per day. Multiply this by 190 (days in a school year) and **Free School Meals are worth £665 a year!**
