As part of our ongoing development plan to become more environmentally friendly, we were delighted to welcome Ellie from East Herts County Council Sustainable Travel Team to our school last Friday.

Ellie conducted workshops across Years 4, 5 and 6 to consider the impact of air pollution on the environment and our own bodies.



Each year discussed what positive changes could be made in order to reduce the level of pollution in our local area and beyond. They also created fact files and posters to show what they had learned throughout the day.

Leadership opportunities in Year 5

School lunches

School lunches are provided free of charge for children in Reception and KS1. For children in KS2 lunches cost £3.20 per day and payment is online via the School Gateway. Please can we remind parents that lunches must be paid for in advance (**pay as you go**) and your account may be frozen if it is in arrears. Thank you.

Free School Meals and Pupil Premium

The school is aware that with the Universal Infant Free School Meals (UIFSM) programme automatically providing all children up to Year 2 with a free meal every day, many families do not apply for means-tested free school meal provision until their child reaches Year 3. This could mean parents are missing out on other sources of support they are entitled to, linked to household income and the benefits of associated pupil premium funding. The course will be under the direction of a qualified TT coach. All abilities welcome, equipment provided.


The course will be limited to 15 children to ensure that all can receive coaching. The course will be held in Much Hadham village hall where the club have three tables.
