

Reminder – Nut Free School



As our school currently has pupils on roll who suffer from a serious nut allergy, we request that parents and carers do not send food to school that contains nuts or sesame.

This includes; all types of nuts, spreads and sandwich fillings containing nuts like peanut butter and Nutella, cereal and chocolate bars which contain nuts; cakes or biscuits which contain nuts, shop bought houmous or pesto.

Please check food labels if you are unsure about ingredients.

Applying for a School Place September 2024

The online application system for applying for a place in Reception class in September 2024 is now open. www.hertfordshire.gov.uk/admissions

School lunches

School lunches are provided free of charge for children in Reception and KS1. For children in KS2 lunches cost £3.20 per day and payment is online via the School Gateway. Please can we remind parents that lunches must be paid for in advance (**pay as you go**) and your account may be frozen if it is in arrears. Thank you.

Free School Meals

The school is aware that with the Universal Infant Free School Meals (UIFSM) programme automatically providing all children up to Year 2 with a free meal every day, many families do not apply for means-tested free school meal provision until their child reaches Year 3. This could mean parents are missing out on other sources of support they are entitled to, linked to household income and the benefits of associated pupil premium funding.
