Beat the parking rush in the mornings!

At our recent Parent Forum meeting, the issue of parking outside school during pick up and drop off times was discussed. This is an issue we will be looking at as a school, as part of our School Travel Plan this academic year.

Can I please take this opportunity to promote our Daily Mile club which runs most mornings from 8.30am. As well as a super active start to the school day, the early start gives parents and carers the chance to beat the rush for car parking spaces outside school in the morning.

Key Stage 2 children must be taken down to the track to be



signed in by an adult (unless they are in Years 5 or 6 and walk to school themselves). They can then be left with the staff member present, thus freeing up parking spaces for others. After the daily mile, these children are trusted to walk into school sensibly themselves. Key Stage 1 parents and carers are asked to stay during the daily mile session and then take their child(ren) to class please.

Home Upgrade Grant (HUG2) – a government-funded scheme through East Herts Council

Families struggling to pay energy bills could get free home energy improvements. HUG2 is a government-funded scheme for low-income households open to homeowners and private tenants in:

• Homes not heated by mains gas which includes oil, coal, LPG or only electric heating.

AND

 Households with a combined annual income of less than £31,000; receiving an incomerelated means-tested benefit such as Universal Credit or there is a child living at the premises eligible for free school meals due to low income.

AND

Hard to heat homes – this is based on your home Energy Performance Certificate (EPC).
 Families will be helped with this part of the assessment.

Applying for a School Place September 2024

School lunches

School lunches are provided free of charge for children in Reception and KS1. For children in KS2 lunches cost £3.20 per day and payment is online via the School Gateway. Please can we remind parents that lunches must be paid for in advance (**pay as you go**) and your account may be frozen if it is in arrears. Thank you.

Free School Meals

The school is aware that with the Universal Infant Free School Meals (UIFSM) programme automatically providing all children up to Year 2 with a free meal every day, many families do not apply for means-tested free school meal provision until their child reaches Year 3. This could mean parents are missing out on other sources of support they are entitled to, linked to household income and the benefits of associated pupil premium funding. Advent Film Night


