### Police Drone Visit

Last week, Year 6 were treated to a visit from Herts Constabulary and their drone. PCs Leon, Jack and Rich explained to the children how the police use drones to help them locate missing people, possible perpetrators of crime and even missing snow leopards! The children then had an opportunity to use the drone themselves to look for their missing classmates within the school grounds. Thankfully, all were found safe and sound.



### Daily Reading

At St Andrew's, we love books and to celebrate reading. We have worked hard over the past couple of years to expand our children's reading horizons through the introduction of class libraries and more diverse texts. But we still need your help! There is a proven link between regular, daily reading and a child's academic success... across all subjects, not just English. Children who read more are exposed to more complex vocabulary, have reduced stress levels and will have a higher level of general knowledge than their peers, who do not read regularly. Whilst we understand that people's lives are busy outside of school with clubs and family commitments, we would encourage you to prioritise reading activities as regularly as possible. Thank you so much for your support with this.

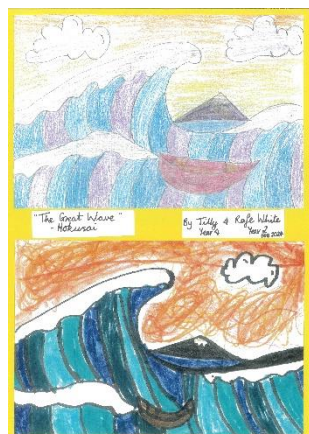

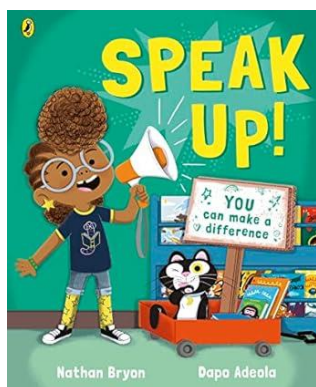
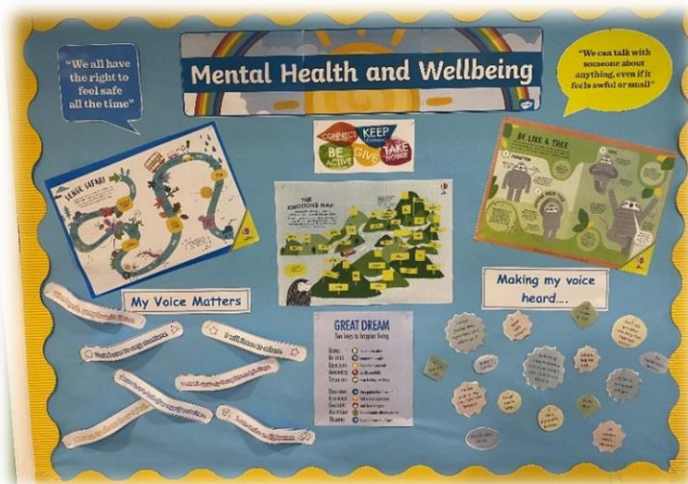
### **“The Great Wave” – Hokusai**

## Children's Mental Health Week

This week is national Children's Mental Health Week. This year the focus is 'My Voice Matters' and how you can use your voice to make positive changes, not just in your own life but in the lives of all those in your community. Mrs Cole kicked off the week, with a worship focusing on how all children have the right to be heard. We talked about how that right extends to children listening to other children and how they can work together to speak up and make a difference. We heard the story of how the determination of a little girl, prevented her local library from closing and looked at role models, such as Marcus Rashford, who have used their influence to prevent child hunger. Mrs Small has also created a beautiful mental health display for the children to look at and reflect on.



## Parent Teacher Consultations New Online Booking System

## School lunches

School lunches are provided free of charge for children in Reception and KS1. For children in KS2 lunches cost £3.20 per day and payment is online via the School Gateway. Please can we remind parents that lunches must be paid for in advance (**pay as you go**) and your account may be frozen if it is in arrears. Thank you.

## Free School Meals and Pupil Premium

The school is aware that with the Universal Infant Free School Meals (UIFSM) programme automatically providing all children up to Year 2 with a free meal every day, many families do not apply for means-tested free school meal provision until their child reaches Year 3. This could mean parents are missing out on other sources of support they are entitled to, linked to household income and the benefits of associated pupil premium funding.
