## **School lunches**

School lunches are provided free of charge for children in Reception and KS1. For children in KS2 lunches cost £3.20 per day and payment is online via the School Gateway. Please can we remind parents that lunches are pre-paid (**pay as you go**). All credits are carried over from term to term and money will be refunded if your child stops having school lunches. Your account may be frozen if it is in arrears and you will need to provide packed lunches. Thank you.

## **Free School Meals**

The school is aware that with the Universal Infant Free School Meals (UIFSM) programme automatically providing all children up to Year 2 with a free meal every day, many families do not apply for means-tested free school meal provision until their child reaches Year 3. This could mean parents are missing out on other sources of support they are entitled to, linked to household income and the benefits of associated pupil premium funding.
