Mindset Movers - Mrs Small

As part of our continuous commitment to pupil personal development, we will be introducing a Peer Mediation programme at playtimes and lunchtimes, which will be known as Mindset Movers.

Peer Mediation has been a nationally recognised programme for many years, and is a specific form of conflict resolution led by pupil mediators but managed by teachers. It helps pupils find fair, mutually acceptable, solutions to school-based problems, by helping children



to resolve simple disagreements themselves with the emphasis on restoring relationships.

Our Y5 pupils opted for the name Mindset Movers following their training because they liked the idea of helping others to change their mindset and look at a problem from another's point of view All our Peer Mediators will be supported by Mrs Small and Mrs Dean. The Mindset Movers will be talking to the children in class worship this week and starting in the playground next week.

School lunches

School lunches are provided free of charge for children in Reception and KS1. For children in KS2 lunches cost £3.20 per day and payment is online via the School Gateway. Please can we remind parents that lunches must be paid for in advance (**pay as you go**) and your account may be frozen if it is in arrears. Thank you.

School lunch price increase notification

Hertfordshire Catering Ltd have informed us of a price increase for the new financial year. Therefore, from 1 April 2024, the price of a junior paid school meal will be £3.35. This is in line with other schools.



Free School Meals and Pupil Premium

The school is aware that with the Universal Infant Free School Meals (UIFSM) programme automatically providing all children up to Year 2 with a free meal every day, many families do not apply for means-tested free school meal provision until their child reaches Year 3. This could mean parents are missing out on other sources of support they are entitled to, linked to household income and the benefits of associated pupil premium funding.
