Participated in national and local schools sporting events:

- #LetGirlsPlay Biggest Football Session Ever.(March 25) resulted in more girls playing football on the playground
- Hertfordshire Bikeability course for Year 6 pupils has resulted in an increase in Pupils who can swim 25m= 88% number of children riding to school.
- Hertfordshire Big Walk and Wheel Campaign has continued with rise in children walking/ scootering to school.

Attendance across school at Morning Running club has increased over the academic vear with a particular rise in children from younger year groups.

Pupils participated in the following over the academic year

School residentials (Aylmerton and Brenscombe) were attended by 93% of our Y5 and Y6 pupils.
