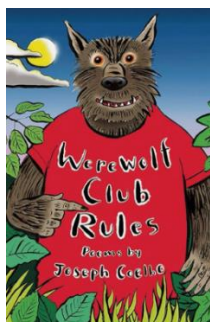
#### Maths

In Maths, we use the Herts for Learning materials along with other resources to support our teaching of the Primary Curriculum. Techniques to support learning include partner talk, games, book work, investigations, use of concrete materials and many other techniques. In the first term, we focus on developing a secure understanding of place value and times table facts; exploring mental and written methods for addition and subtraction - and solving problems relating to estimation and measure.



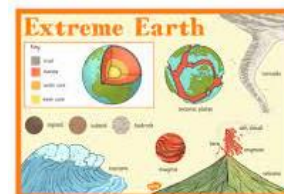
#### English

This year, we are excited to be kicking off the teaching of English, in every class across the school, with a poetry unit. The aim of these units is to immerse the children in rich vocabulary and language, that will inspire them and demonstrate how words can evoke emotion from the reader at every level. We are really excited that in Year 3, we will be exploring poems such as 'I am a writer' and 'A little bit of food' by Joseph Coelho. Moving forward, we are currently updating the texts that are taught across the school. You will be able to see these detailed on our long-term plans, when they are published on the class pages of our website over the next couple of weeks. Grammar teaching will be incorporated into the teaching of writing, but may also take place in stand-alone grammar lessons. In addition, we will be carrying out daily whole class Guided Reading sessions and a number of dedicated spelling sessions each week. The children will also continue to develop their handwriting skills.



#### Geography

Our topic for the term will be Extreme Earth. In this exciting Geography based topic, we will mainly focus on volcanoes, earthquakes and mountains. We will develop an understanding of the earth's structure and how this impacts extreme weather conditions such as tsunamis and tornados. Some of our geography learning will relate to our art this term too. Towards the end of the term we will also be improving a number of other geography skills such as map reading and compass directions.



#### Science

Our Science learning links nicely to our topic in the first half term as we will be learning about rocks and fossils. The children will learn about the different types of rock and how they are formed as well as the life cycle of a fossil. In the second half term we will move onto learning about different forces.

## RE

In RE this year, we will continue to use The Emmanuel Project. This term the children will begin by focusing on the religions of Christianity and Islam. We will base our learning on the following questions:

Autumn 1: How does a Muslim show their submission and obedience to Allah?

Autumn 2: How do Christians show that reconciliation with God and others is important?



## Art and DT

In Art we will be looking at landscape and volcano pictures. We will also be making model volcanoes which we will erupt too. During the second half of the term, we will explore the intricacies of levers and linkages in Design and Technology.

## PE

The children will have PE on Wednesday and Friday every week. Please ensure that children come to school in their PE kits on those days. Over the course of the term we will be focusing on a range of gymnastic skills and team games as well as exploring different forms of tactics and communication. Lessons will continue to be outside so please make sure that clothing is appropriate for all weathers.



## Computing

Over the coming term we are going to be looking at online safety and remind ourselves how to keep safe at all times. We will also develop our coding skills and start to understand how spreadsheets are created and used.

## Music

Using our new music scheme, 'Sing-Up', the children will follow a unit called 'I've been to Harlem' in which they will develop their knowledge of notes in a melody. During the second half term, the children will learn about folk music and 'sound symmetry' - patterns in songs.



## PHSE

RHE lessons will continue to follow our JIGSAW scheme of work. This term looking at what is special about ourselves and celebrating differences amongst us.

## Further information

Please continue to **read daily** and practice **times tables** with your child at home. This is essential to support their learning and progress in school. Additional tasks will continue to be set via **Microsoft Teams** on a weekly basis which will be handed out on a Thursday/ Friday and returned the following Wednesday. These will often be a maths and spelling activity but may also include other subject areas.

Please provide your child with a **daily healthy snack** for break time and please ensure your child has a **named water bottle** in school each day. Also please provide your children with a **waterproof coat** even if it looks like it is going to be a warm, sunny day. Please can all clothing be clearly named as well.
